5 Key Dates



September 13, 2007 - UN General Assembly Adopts

September 13, 2007 - National Chief Responds to Position

December 11, 2007 - AFN Lobbies Internationally

November 10, 2010 - AFN National Chief “Document Compels”

May 10, 2016 - Canada Officially removes objector status

Indigenous Peoples vs. Aboriginal Peoples

Section 35 - Aboriginal Peoples

(1) The existing aboriginal and treaty rights of the aboriginal people in Canada are hereby recognized and affirmed.

(2) In this act “Aboriginal Peoples of Canada” includes the Indian, Inuit, and Métis Peoples of Canada.
